

International Nursing Conference: Integrated Caring for Persons with COVID-19, Other Airborne Transmission Disease And Chronic Diseases - A Virtual Conference (Zoom Meetings), March 17-18, 2022

Corona virus (COVID-19) has infected more than 252.5 million people with a total 5.1 million deaths, of which 228.2 million have people recovered. The number of these incidents continues to increase rapidly in Asian countries and throughout the world. Although several countries have successfully enforced new normal habits, implemented lockdown, and encouraged vaccination, their countries still experience a significant increase in COVID-19 cases, which cause concern about health care services and health professionals. Specifically, health care providers have experienced shortages of medical supplies, and protective equipment, as well as inconsistent availability. Health services available for people with COVID-19 infection were established based on the availability of health care resources and efficient health service delivery during and after the pandemic. Some of the strategies implemented include telehealth development for primary and tertiary health services as well as strengthened collaboration among health professionals to achieve optimal medical services and effective timely medical treatment.

The outbreaks of COVID-19 can infect people of different ages, particularly affecting the older age group. In addition, people with underlying co-morbidity and immunosuppressive have appeared to be more susceptible to severe illness and a higher risk of deaths. The COVID-19 pandemic has also affected the process of routine comprehensive care necessary for chronic patients due to disruption of delivery care resulting in patients have less chance for community-based support and care. A coherent and integrated healthcare system with a high degree of proactive care and high technology with tele health can help initiate early diagnostics and address chronic diseases in new ways that empower the patients to be involved in the handling of their own disease during the COVID-19 pandemic.
